### WHATIS FWC DOING IN OUR CHANNELS?

The City of Cape Coral reports in their Spring 2020 Newsletter that the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission (FWC) is planning on inspecting the Cape Coral Waterway for illegal and outdated signage. The State of Florida requires all signage to be permitted by FWC. For those interested in seeing the permitted signs, FWC maintains a website that maps all of the permitted signs throughout the state. It can be found at: <a href="https://public.myfwc.com/crossdoi/lepermitsystem/uniformwaterwaymarkermap.aspx">https://public.myfwc.com/crossdoi/lepermitsystem/uniformwaterwaymarkermap.aspx</a>

This online map includes all of the Manatee Slow Zones, Slow Speed/Minimum Wake, Idle Speed/No Wake and some other allowed signs. For those interested in FWC guidelines for waterway signage you can find in here: <a href="https://myfwc.com/media/13268/boat\_waterwaymarkerguidelines.pdf">https://myfwc.com/media/13268/boat\_waterwaymarkerguidelines.pdf</a>.

As a reminder, the FWC designates that the entry channels to and from the river are "Slow Speed/Minimum Wake". FWC defines this as "...a vessel be fully off plane and completely settled into the water. The vessel must proceed at a speed that is reasonable and prudent under the prevailing circumstances so as to avoid the creation of an excessive wake or other hazardous condition that endangers or is likely to endanger other vessels or persons using the waterway. Due to the varying speeds at which vessels of different sizes and configurations may travel

while in compliance, there is no specific numeric speed assigned to 'SLOW SPEED'."

The canals in Cape Coral are all "Idle Speed/No Wake." Yes, despite what you may have heard or have been told, Cape Coral has codified this in the city Code of Ordinances. Enforcement of this is another issue that you can take up with the City Council. You can find Cape Coral's Waterway Regulations here; <a href="https://library.municode.com/fl/cape\_coral/codes/code\_of\_ordinances?nodeld=CH10LAWAUSRE.">https://library.municode.com/fl/cape\_coral/codes/code\_of\_ordinances?nodeld=CH10LAWAUSRE.</a> FWC say it "Idle Speed/No Wake....is the most restrictive vessel speed. Idle speed requires a vessel to proceed at a speed no greater than that which will maintain steerage and headway. At no time is any vessel required to proceed so slowly that the operator is unable to maintain control over the vessel or any other vessel or object that it has under tow."

We have our fair share of "Slow Speed/Minimum Wake" zones, if you are not sure where they are, pick up a copy of the SWFL Waterways Guide issued by Lee County at the Squadron office or our booth at the Farmers Market. You can also view it online at <a href="http://swflwaterways.com">http://swflwaterways.com</a>.

# SAFE BOATING TIPS FROM OUR ABCINSTRUCTORS

## APRIL FLOWERS MAY BRING SHOWERS

So spring is in the air and the snowbirds are starting to think about flying north. This means soon we will have less boat traffic out on our waterways. It also means the temperatures are starting to rise. In our ABC book, a lot of time is spent covering cold water immersion and hypothermia. The first is not really a concern here in SWFL, but the second can be an issue down here even in the warm weather.

If you get caught in a spring shower while out on the water without any rain gear, you can experience hypothermia. The air passing over your wet clothes can cool your body significantly. The typical first signs that you have hypothermia include shivering, followed by numbness in the hands or feet. If you experience these symptoms, take action to get out of the wet clothes and into something dry.

To prevent hypothermia, invest in some rain gear for your boat. You don't have to spend a lot of money. Inexpensive single use ponchos are better than not having any rain gear. Buy a bunch of these ponchos and keep them in a handy place on the boat. At the first sign of rain, put one on.

If you have a boat without a canvas or hard top over the helm station, you may want to consider a carrying an inexpensive motorcycle helmet. Some of our spring and summer showers can be quite intense. A helmet with a visor can be a real lifesaver if you get caught in a storm.

For more tips like these, consider taking one our many safe boating classes. And if your boating buddies haven't taken ABC yet, tell them about it. We still need your support in finding new students.


